New items providing care, comfort

New hospital beds are being rolled into place, a new bathing system is soaking patients in comforting care and additional lifesaving equipment now rests in the ambulance.

All these items and more are now a reality, thanks to the generosity of those who gave to Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center (JMHCC) during Giving Hearts Day.

The Jacobson Memorial Hospital Foundation raised more than \$80,000 during the Foundation's participation in Giving Hearts Day Feb. 8. The one-day online event raised funds to support JMHCC in Elgin to fulfill a "wishlist" of needs.

Now, that wishlist is being fulfilled.

The Jacobson Memorial Hospital Foundation initially helped fill the wishlist by approving the purchase of a bathing system for \$26,221, using donations from year-round donors. This new system replaces an outdated bathing system, which was showing small cracks.

Ten adjustable patient beds were also on the wishlist. Older styles of beds have not been updated for quite some time and more user-friendly beds were needed. Six new adjustable beds are in place and four more are on their way.

"Staff at JMHCC would like to sincerely thank anyone who donated to assist us in updating our bathing system and hospital beds. These items are used every day by residents and patients, and your donations help us improve our all-around care at the facility. We are very grateful to be supported by our local communities!" says Director of Nursing Jessica "Teddy" Werner.

Another important wishlist item was repairing the wall-mounted aspirator in the emergency room. A portable aspirator was currently being used. That piece of equipment is now repaired and in place.

Ten new recliners have also been ordered for the activities room and patient rooms, and 40 waterproof recliner covers are already in place.

"We thank everyone for the wonderful donations we received to help us put these items in place," says CEO Scott Brooks. "The beds are making a big difference and the residents are excited about the new bathing system."

Another piece of equipment was purchased for the New Leipzig/Elgin Ambulance Service – a RAD-57 EMS package for the detection of carbon monoxide (CO) to prevent CO poisoning.

"It measures the carbon monoxide levels in the blood system," explains Paramedic Cary Kehr. A pulse oximeter measures how much oxygen is in someone's blood, but will show perfect oxygen levels when the patient's blood is actually being affected by carbon monoxide.

"If you have one instance where you use it, it pays for itself," Kehr says.

During fires, the ambulance can monitor firefighters with the equipment to assure they are safe.



"It's a very neat tool and not many ambulances have it," Kehr says.

The Elgin Lions Club donated additional funds to purchase that piece of equipment specifically.

An additional stair chair for the New Leipzig/Elgin Ambulance Service has also been ordered. The stair chair is a device that helps get people out of a house with stairs or tight spaces much easier for the patient and the responders. The second stair chair will go into the second ambulance.

"It's something we use on 50% of our calls, if not greater," Kehr says.

"We couldn't do it without that funding," Kehr says. "It makes it possible. It enables us to expand our level of care to the communities. We couldn't do it without those private donations. It's very much appreciated by all of us."

Several larger donors showed their support during Giving Hearts Day. First International Bank & Trust in Elgin donated a \$12,000 match, and the Elgin Lions Club donated \$12,000. H.A. Thompson & Sons, Bismarck, donated \$5,000, and Dakota Community Bank, New Leipzig, gave \$2,500.
