

JMHCC recognized nationally for quality care

For the second year in a row, Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center (JMHCC) has been recognized nationally for its quality care.

As part of National Rural Health Day Nov. 18, JMHCC in Elgin announces it has been recognized as a top hospital in quality care, earning a 2021 Performance Leadership Award for top quartile performance in quality.

JMHCC was spotlighted by The Chartis Center of Rural Health and the National Organization of State Offices of Rural Health for overall excellence in quality. The Performance Leadership Award program utilizes the results of the Hospital Strength INDEX® to recognize top performance among critical access hospitals, and rural and community hospitals.
